The City Council met in regular session at the City Hall, Webster City, Iowa at 4:30 p.m. on May 21, 2018 upon call of the Mayor and the advance agenda. The meeting was called to order by Mayor John Hawkins and roll being called there were present John Hawkins, Mayor in the chair, and the following Council Members: Matt McKinney, Brian Miller, Jim Talbot and Logan Welch.

Shirley Helgevold, MIDAS Council of Governments, was present and outlined the following information on the Status of CDBG Funded Activities.

STATUS OF CDBG FUNDED ACTIVITIES May 21, 2018

1. General description of accomplishments to date:

Six homes in the target area have been rehabilitated to date and one home is in the construction phase of the rehabilitation process.

2. Summary of expenditures to date:

So far, the City has expended a total of \$182,935.56, including:

- \$181,700.56 in CDBG funds
- \$0 in City funds
- \$1,235 in homeowner contributions

Of that to date the following has been spent:

- \$118,671.21 on rehabilitation construction
- \$11,302.57 on general administration
- \$28,042,99 on direct administration
- \$746.96 on lead hazard carrying cost
- \$22,133.00 on lead hazard reduction
- \$2,038.83 on temporary relocation
- 3. General description of remaining work:

Rehabilitation of the final house is underway and should be completed by June 30, 2018.

4. General description of changes made to the project budget, performance targets, activity schedules, project scope, location, objectives or beneficiaries:

The original project was to rehabilitate 10 owner-occupied homes in the targeted area to the Iowa Minimum Housing Standards. Due to estimates/bids coming in over the \$24,999 limit and homeowners withdrawing from the program only 7 homes will be completed.

The City received \$345,990 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA). Originally the City committed \$27,000 for rehabilitation coming over the \$24,999 limit but due to rule changes none of this funding will be used. The CDBG contract has an expiration date of July 31, 2018.

The City has contracted with MIDAS Council of Governments to provide grant administration. The original contract was a do not exceed amount of \$18,000 of which \$11,302.57 has been paid to date.

The City has contracted with MIDAS Council of Governments to provided Technical Services. The original contract was for \$45,000 if which \$28,789.95 has been paid to date.
